SAFE HAVEN is a non-profit organization that provides emergency shelter and support services to victims of domestic violence and sexual assault. Our mission is to encourage a safe community, free of physical and sexual violence and emotional abuse, through shelter, caring, advocacy and education.

Fundraisers, along with individual, business and other contributors, allow Safe Haven to help hundreds of families each year. Your contributions provide for food, shelter, programming expenses, supplies and other needed items. Without community support, many families would continue to live in fear.

2016 was a very busy year with 55 women and 67 children receiving safe shelter, with an average stay of 27.3 days, total bed nights of 3,385; 514 victims (335 women, 21 men and 158 children) receiving advocacy and support. Advocates answered 2,064 crisis calls from our community members. Shelter was never empty and was occupied by two or more families 99% of the year. Shelter was over capacity (5 or more families) 29% or 104 days.

**1. Bill and Deb Laehn Garden
W10565 County Road A, Gresham**

Hwy 47/55 north to County A, west on A to U, right on U, to first house on left OR Hwy 29 west to U toward Gresham, pass A (on right) to first property on left. Property is on U.

**2. Pete and Mikki Moesch Garden
1004 S. Evergreen St., Shawano**

East of Main Street on the corner of Lieg and Evergreen Street, next door to the Bartelt garden.

**3. Bob Bartelt Garden
918 E. Lieg, Shawano**

East of Main Street on the corner of Lieg and Cleveland, directly behind the Moesch garden.

**4. Linda Balthazor & Paul Clark Garden
826 S. Evergreen St., Shawano**

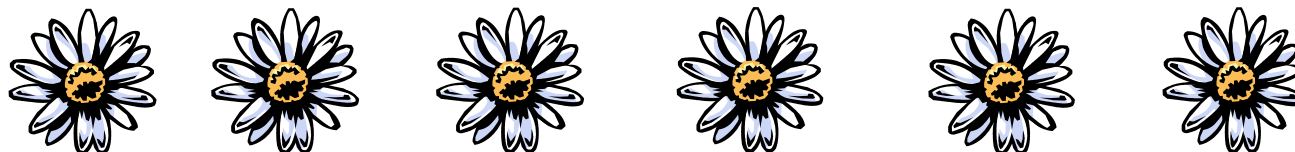
North of Lieg two blocks.

**5. Ben and Janet Hiebing Garden
W5001 Lulu Lake Drive, Shawano**

Lake Drive north 2 miles past County Park, left on Loon Lake Drive 1/2 mile to right on Lulu Lake Drive, 1/2 mile to another right on Lulu Lake Drive.

**6. Dan and Sue Spielvogel Garden
N7130 Cozy Oak Circle, Shawano**

Lake Drive north 2 miles past County Park, left on Loon Lake Drive (go past Lulu Lake Drive 1/2 mile), right on Cozy Oak Circle.

Nestled between a cedar swamp and an old growth hemlock ridge you will find a tranquil woodland garden planted with many native plants. As you enter the backyard you will hear the relaxing sound of the water feature and enjoy the forest views. Many pieces of garden art, as well as several stainless steel sculptures by metal artist Kirk Yazel, adorn the garden. If you are lucky, you may get a glimpse of the wildlife that abounds in this woodland haven.

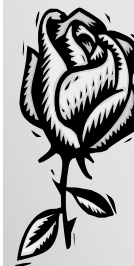
Dan and Sue Spielvogel
